



ALYESKA SKI CLUB MASTERS PROGRAM GUIDE

The Alyeska Ski Club Masters Program consists of alpine skiers eighteen years or older who are seeking skiing and training opportunities to become better technical skiers in a fun, learning environment. The Masters program is open to all abilities and is designed to increase your technical skills through guided free skiing, drills, and gate training (and optional competitions). Most important, is that you are joining a group of people who really like to ski and have fun!

Members, through their membership fee, are entitled to full use of the Alyeska Ski Club Race Training Center, located at the base of Ted's Express. The Race Training Center gives members a place to change into their ski gear, store day bags, eat lunch and even wax your skis. **(The RTC will remain closed to athletes this season due to current Covid protocols. However, it will be open for small groups to warm up during particularly cold or wet days.)**

The training season usually begins in mid-December and continues through the beginning of April. There are fourteen or more weekend training days and eight races scheduled throughout the year, which consist of four slaloms and four giant slaloms. Additional Wednesday and Friday gate training is also offered during the season.

The social aspect of the Masters is what truly makes our program fun. We meet each weekend as a group, who are excited about skiing and improving our skills. After a great day of skiing or racing we meet at a variety of social events, post-race parties and potlucks, sponsored by the ODOM Corporation, which are covered by your program fees. All members and their families are invited to attend. At the end of the ski season there is a Year End Awards Banquet with Overall Awards and video (also included in your membership).

Programming / Schedule

The Alyeska Masters will be offering weekend training and racing for all levels of skiers (see schedule for training, races and social events). The Masters Program offers fourteen days or more of training through the season. We will usually schedule four slalom races, and four giant slalom races throughout the year. All of these races will occur on various runs at Mt. Alyeska. Racing is OPTIONAL.

Coaches will perform an assessment of your abilities and advancement throughout the season and will suggest or place you in a group that is best for you.

By enrolling in the full-time Masters Program, athletes will also be entitled to train gates during the Wednesday and Friday sessions with coaches. Some of these training days will be in conjunction with the Juniors Program teams. There will be no group skiing during the mid-week.

Training / Time / Notifications

On days that Masters are scheduled to ski we meet at the Race Training Center (RTC) at the base of Ted's Express. Athletes will check in with the coaches at 10:00am. The schedule for the day will be written on the [Masters Notice Board posted outside the RTC](#). [Team Snap will be the primary form of updates for the notification such as weather and conditions that may result in changes to the day's training or race schedule.](#)

Please make sure that you provide your primary email and mobile number in your registration. Wednesday and Friday gate training and weekend training days and times will be communicated via Team Snap in advance.

2021-22 Race Season

Member Racers that have pre-paid for the race series (\$150 for 8 races and one time fee of \$25 for a bib number) may go straight to the race venue. Information on times will be posted outside the RTC and sent via TeamSnap. Late racers may go to the start and will be slotted in by the Coach. Most races will have course inspection approximately between 10:30 and 11:30. The race fee covers the race (events team), video of race, and post race celebrations.

Member and non-member racers will sign-up by the Friday before the weekend races online via TeamSnap on the Masters web site. Currently there is not an in person race sign up at the RTC. Details to come via email and Team Snap.

Race Classes

We will be using the Masters National age groups and start order. Age classes for National & Regional Championships as stated in the Masters competition guide 2021-2022 are listed below. Class is determined by racers age as of Dec. 31st of the season.

Race Points

Points are based on how you place in each race within your class throughout the ski season. Your race points will be utilized for an overall award at the end of the season as well as an award after each race for the top three finishers for each class. We will have other awards to recognize the interesting events that take place in Masters Ski Racing.

Earning Points:

1st Place = 10 points

2nd Place = 7 points

3rd Place = 5 points

4th Place = 4 points

5th Place = 3 points

6th Place = 2 points

Everyone who races gets 1 point for participating!
